



Submission guidelines

International Journal of Environmental Epistemology Cosmotheoros

Articles and reviews submitted for publication must be original and unpublished, except for translations that, due to their relevance, the journal's editorial team deems appropriate to publish. The publication of an article in the journal will depend on the evaluation and editing process of the text. Each author will be notified, via mail, about the process and the decision made by the editorial team. No article nominated for publication can be simultaneously nominated in other journals.

Cosmotheoros does not have a specific length limit for articles, but the average of publications ranges between 8,000 and 12,000 words for in-depth articles and 3,000 to 8,000 for academic reviews, in both cases including references. Submitted articles that are exceptionally long will have to be more relevant to the field than others considered for publication. The articles will be evaluated through the double-blind peer review system in no more than three (3) months. The authors will be notified of the process via email with comments from both the evaluators and the editorial committee.

The articles and reviews submitted for publication must be related to the academic field of environmental epistemology, otherwise the proposals will be rejected.

Since the work of the editorial committee is voluntary and does not have any economic fees, we ask the authors to submit the final versions of their manuscripts in the way that best fits the submission guidelines so that the evaluation and edition time does not extend unnecessary:

- Title: Times New Roman, 16pt, centered.
- Author names: Times New Roman, 11pt, centered.
- Affiliation: Times New Roman, italics, 9pt, centered, under the name.
- Abstract and keywords (in Spanish and English): Times New Roman, 9pt, justified.
- Size page: Letter (21.59 cm x 27.94 cm).
- Main text: Times New Roman, 12pt, 1.5 line spacing, justified.
- The second and subsequent paragraphs after the title and subtitles must be indented on the first line by 0.5 cm.
- Try to use a maximum of three headings: first level 1. HEADING: Times New Roman, 14pt; second level 1.1. Heading: Times New Roman, 14pt; and third level 1.1.1. Heading: Times New Roman, 11pt.
- Footnotes: at the bottom of the page where they are referenced: Times New Roman, 8pt, justified.
- References must be arranged in alphabetical order: Times New Roman with 0.5 cm indentation, 1.5 line spacing, 11pt, justified. We ask authors to be very careful with the use of the APA standard format (latest version). This usually takes editors a lot of time, so we hope that authors have their full attention to organize the references in the best possible way.
